



Beluga Conservation Conundrum

This workshop guides students through the challenges of creating a species conservation plan. Students will learn about the endangered Cook Inlet beluga whale as well as the values and opinions of different interest groups. Using what they learn, students will create a mock conservation plan for the Cook Inlet belugas. Students will compare their plan with current conservation efforts and discover ways they can help this species.

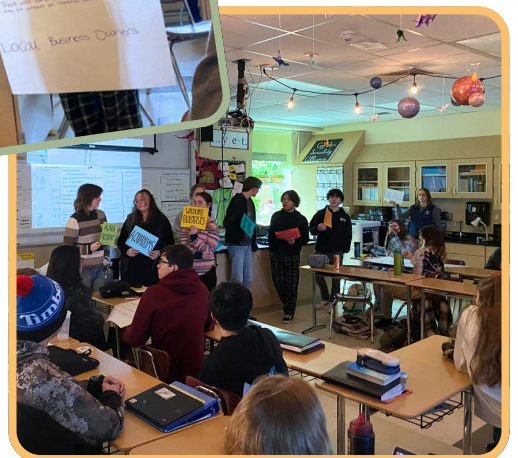
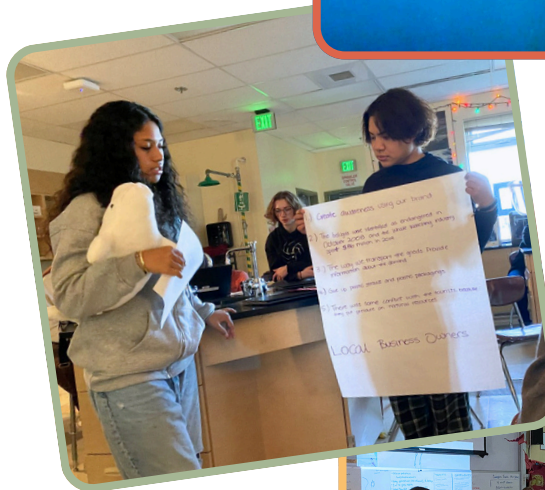
Program Length: 2 ½ hours
